

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD: 7th January 2024



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, the manifestation, the revelation of the Light of Jesus as the Saviour of the World. The wise men having seen the sign of the star, they grasped its message and set off on a long journey. They point out to us the path of our journey through life: by following a light, they sought *the* light. They set out in search of God. They took the risk. I think there are many times in our lives when we are presented with opportunities to do good and to be part of something better. But we must take the risk and go for it.

### Learn from the Magi

(Epiphany reflection by Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter *Admirabile Signum*, on the meaning and importance of the nativity scene)

At the feast of Epiphany we place the statues of the Three Kings in the Christmas crèche. Observing the star, those wise men from the East set out for Bethlehem, in order to find Jesus and to offer him their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. These costly gifts have an allegorical meaning: gold honours Jesus' kingship, incense his divinity, myrrh his sacred humanity that was to experience death and burial.

As we contemplate this aspect of the nativity scene, we are called to reflect on the responsibility of every Christian to spread the Gospel. Each of us is called to bear glad tidings to all, testifying by our practical works of mercy to the joy of knowing Jesus and his love. The Magi teach us that people can come to Christ by a very long route. Men of wealth, sages from afar, thirsting for the infinite, they set out on the long and perilous journey that would lead them to Bethlehem (cf. *Mt* 2:1-12). Great joy comes over them in the presence of the Infant King. They are not scandalized by the poor surroundings, but immediately fall to their knees to worship him. Kneeling before him, they understand that the God who with sovereign wisdom guides the course of the stars also guides the course of history, casting down the mighty and raising up the lowly. Upon their return home, they would certainly have told others of this amazing encounter with the Messiah, thus initiating the spread of the Gospel among the nations.
