At Blessed Sacrament Catholic Primary School, we know that in order to achieve our very best, we need to attend school every day, on time and be ready to learn.

Our school attendance target is 97% and we do our very best to achieve this.

Here are some of the good reasons to come to school:

- ▼ To learn lots of new things.
- ▶ Being at school every day gives you more choices in life because it improves your chances of getting a job or going to college and university when you get older.
- Being part of a group helps us to get on well with others and make friends.
- ▼ Taking part in clubs and teams is fun and helps us to play together and get better at what we do.

- ★ At Blessed Sacrament, every child is expected come into school at least 97% of the time.

If you don't come to school:

- ▼ The people who look after you telephone or email school to let the school know what is wrong.
- ▼ They may call into the school office and explain why you are not in.

Our Attendance rewards are:

- ▼ Toast is given each week to the class with the best attendance in each phase.
- Each term, the class in the Infant building or Junior Building with the most attendance money in their pot chooses how to spend it.
- ♥ Children in for a full week are given a raffle ticket which goes into a special draw. A winner is drawn at the end of each term and the winner receives a voucher.
- Children who meet 'Attendance Drive' goals receive a treat.
- Children with 100% Attendance for the full year are specially rewarded.
- We have special 'Calendar Days' throughout the year to help improve attendance and punctuality.
- Each morning, a group of children attend our 'Wellbeing Breakfast' (for 6 weeks).
